The objective of alternative modes of assessment is the compensation of disadvantages that (may) arise during exams or courses due to an impairment. Alternative modes of assessment are guided by the learning outcomes similarly to the initial mode of assessment. This means that the content to be learned, the scope and content of the exam as well as the cognitive application of the learning materials remain the same. Only the mode is adjusted to the impairment.

An application for an alternative mode of assessment must be **submitted to the competent directorate of studies (SPL)** according to section 11 of the Statutes of the University of Vienna – study law¹. Please use Acrobat Reader to fill in the form.

You should contact your teachers/examiners as soon as possible (ideally before or at the start of the semester).
